

Compost Sites

Anoka County has two compost sites accepting yard waste and organics year-round weather permitting. Please see hours of operation below. You must unload your own yard waste and debag all materials.

Please keep leaves/grass, tree waste and organic materials seperate from each other because they are deposited in different areas.

Leaves, Grass and Non-woody Yard Waste: Accept debagged grass clippings, leaves, garden waste, weeds, soft-bodied green plant materials, straw, acorns, pine cones and needles. No charge up to four cubic yards. **Tree Waste:** Accept brush, evergreen boughs, logs and stumps. Tree waste may be loose or bundled. Fees vary based on the amount and the diameter of the materials.

Organics: Accept all food scraps, most non-recyclable and uncoated food-soiled paper and BPI (Biodegradeable Products Institute) certified compostable products. **FREE to county residents.** For additional details go to **AnokaCounty.us/Yardwaste.**
